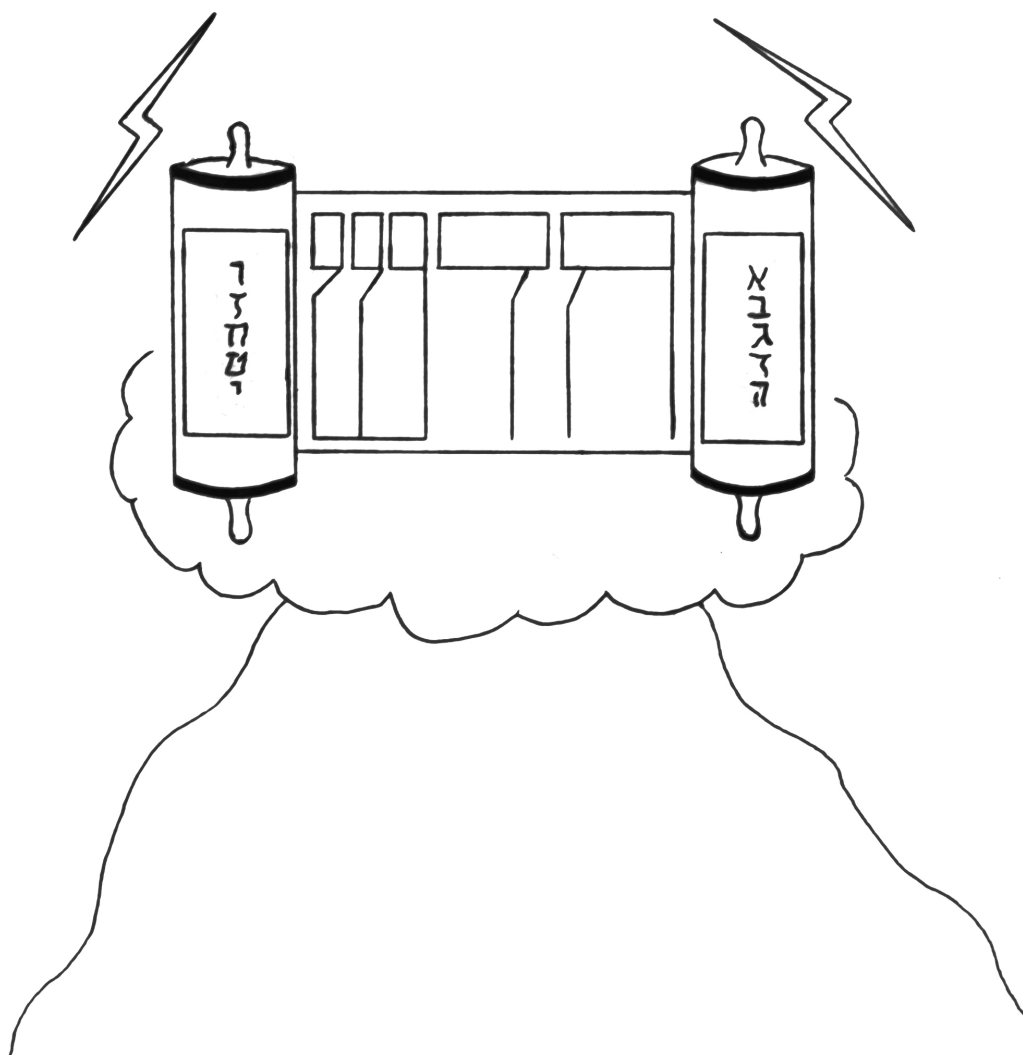

In Memory of Dovid Rieber, A"H

Although our son, Dovid, was an active member of the block's little shul, he could not be counted in their minyan.

Dovid was such a special boy that Hashem called for him 17 days before his Bar Mitzvah; which never gave him the chance of fulfilling his dream of being counted in a minyan.

Once there was a Chassid who went to the Rebbe and asked a question. In their village there are nine men and a boy almost Bar Mitzvah age, how can they count him in the minyan? The Rebbe answered; by giving the boy a Sefer Torah he could be counted.

The most beautiful and meaningful way to commemorate the memory of a loved one is by dedicating a Torah scroll in their name. The reading from the Torah scroll brings great merit to the departed soul in whose honor the Torah has been scribed.

The Torah is the heart of the Jewish people, its lifeblood, and its nourishment. The Torah is referred to as the "Tree of Life."

Now with the writing of this Sefer Torah, Dovid will have his share in the minyan.

Buy A Letter In The Torah:

People will still be able to participate in the writing of the new Torah, whether they attend or not, by buying letters for themselves or their families just before the start of the Dedication Ceremony. Those who wish to purchase letters will be honored by the scribe as their letter is announced and entered into Dovid's Sefer Torah. Our Sages said that one who writes even one letter in a Torah is considered to have written the entire scroll. These letters will be completed by 12:00pm promptly.

In Jewish tradition, just as a wedding is to a family, so too is a Torah to its community. It is celebrated joyously with the Torah being accompanied under a chupah (marriage canopy) followed by Hakafot, singing, dancing, and refreshments in a festive atmosphere.
